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2 NIGHTS IN

NamibRand Nature Reserve

Spanning an area of 172,200 hectares and encompassing four distinct ecosystems, the Namib Rand Reserve is among the largest privately owned game parks in Southern Africa. Having been named Africa's first International Dark Sky Reserve, it is one of the least light-polluted areas in the world, so don't miss this excellent star gazing opportunity.



OVERNIGHT: KWESSI DUNE LODGE

Kwessi Dune Lodge is surrounded by the NamibRand Nature Reserve, Namibia. The lodge features twelve air-conditioned chalets, that are equipped with air-conditioning, Wi-Fi, and a stargazer room to view the night sky. This is a private experience on a private reserve.

Walvis Bay

Situated along Namibia's spectacular coastline, just south of Swakopmund, Walvis Bay (Whale Bay) is a thriving town, Namibia's principal harbour and one of the country's most popular tourist centres. It is known for its natural lagoon, striking orange sand dunes and wealth of outdoor activities.



OVERNIGHT: FLAMINGO VILLAS BOUTIQUE HOTEL

Nestled on the edge of the tidal lagoon of Walvis Bay, surrounded by scores of Lesser and Greater Flamingos lies Flamingo Villas Boutique Hotel. This hotel boasts with beautiful views over the lagoon where spectacular sunsets and Flamingos on display are an every day occurrence.

Skeleton Coast

Stretching from the Swakop River to southern Angola, the Skeleton Coast is known as the 'Land God Made in Anger' and is remoteness at its best. Thousands of miles of sandy desert dotted with shipwrecks meet with the cold waters of the Atlantic and somehow an amazing array of wildlife and flora manages to survive in this harsh but beautiful environment.



OVERNIGHT: SHIPWRECK LODGE

Uniquely designed around the enigmatic shipwrecks that line Namibia's Skeleton Coast, there's nowhere on the continent quite like Shipwreck Lodge.

Kaokaveld

The Kaokaveld is a dry, mountainous and relatively undeveloped region that takes in the harsh beauty of Namibia's Skeleton Coast and the copper sands of the northern Namib Desert. The area is inhabited by three main ethnic groups – the Damara, Herero and Himba people – each with their own unique customs, traditions and rituals. A diverse variety of wildlife can be found in the desert including: giraffes, desert-adapted elephant, black rhino, a variety of endemic reptiles and many different bird species.



OVERNIGHT: HOANIB DESERT VALLEY CAMP

Located in one of the most beautiful areas of Namibia, the camp and its surrounds are truly breathtaking with many visitors feeling time spent here is a life affirming experience. Your days are spent exploring this spectacular area, understanding its unique geology, wildlife and culture.

Onguma Game Reserve

OVERNIGHT: ONGUMA THE FORT
